TRAINING FUTURE PHYSICIANS

Pullman Regional Hospital and Washington State University's Elson S. Floyd College of Medicine have partnered to establish the Family Medicine Residency Program where resident physicians spend three years at Pullman Regional to complete their medical training.

Resident physicians receive training in neurology, cardiology, orthopedics, obstetrics, pediatrics, emergency care and surgery in addition to seeing patients regularly in the Family Medicine Residency Center. With more than 500 applicants competing for three positions annually, Pullman Regional Hospital is a desirable choice for resident physicians wishing to pursue rural medicine in our region.
