The CEO works collaboratively with the administrative team with input from physicians, clinical and support staff and community stakeholders and reports to the Pullman Regional Hospital Board of Commissioners.

Pullman Regional Hospital has been and will continue to be a self-sustaining, patient and employee-focused, award-winning hospital with a unique, open, collaborative and inclusive culture. We are independent, and choice remains a consistent theme in defining how we carry about our activities.

We are a critical access, not-for-profit, public hospital district providing exceptional healthcare for everyone. Situated 8 miles from the Idaho border, our hospital serves WA and ID residents, students, faculty and game day fans of Washington State University (a PAC-12 University) and the University of Idaho (a Big Sky University).



Once a staple on the WSU campus as Pullman Memorial Hospital, we found a new home in 2005 on Bishop Blvd. with room to build a state-of-the-art 95,000 square foot facility. The building is home to our inpatient, outpatient, and emergency care services plus a variety of independent medical practices.

In addition to responding to the growing healthcare needs of our community, a growth mentality and community support have inspired numerous expansions and ancillary services continue to find alternative space to make room for direct patient care. Our shared vision is to continue expanding the scope of the hospital services to strengthen access to primary and specialty care services.

Financial Health

Gross revenues exceeded 142 million in 2019 and 139 million in 2020. Operating expenses were 76 million in 2019 and 74 in 2020. 2019 operating margin was \$1.7 million and 2020 operating margin was \$9.1 million. Philanthropic funds raised in 2019 were \$3.8 million; in 2020, \$2.3 million was raised.

Philanthropy & Volunteers

For over 75 years, Pullman Regional Hospital has relied and called upon its community members and regional partners to provide the margin of excellence for our medical community. The Pullman Regional Hospital Foundation is the key component of this part of the hospital mission, vision, and strategic plan.

The Pullman Regional Hospital Foundation relies on a small, efficient team, led by the Chief Development Officer, and a working board of volunteers for governance, fundraising and advocacy. The Foundation's Board of Directors is comprised of 23 regional leaders that represent many professions and job services in a rural university community. Each board member is asked to not only provide governance duties and financial oversight, but also be an active contributor and advocate for Pullman Regional Hospital and the Foundation. The Foundation uses its board members and staff to raise philanthropic funds through events as well as provide leadership with annual giving and capital campaigns.



Our Partnerships

Washington State University: Pullman Regional Hospital has had a strong relationship with WSU since 1947. We complement a world-class university with world-class healthcare. Meaningful collaborations exist through shared services with WSU Cougar Health Services, clinical rotation opportunities at our hospital and clinics, supporting WSU faculty in healthcare-related research, mutual support in meeting professional recruitment needs, on-demand access to student-athlete cardiology testing, and our recently accredited WSU Family Medicine Residency Program at Pullman Regional Hospital.

On November 8, 2018 we formalized our partnership by signing of a Memorandum of Understanding signifying a formal continuation of long-standing collaboration between the two public entities. At a ceremony held at the hospital, Pullman Regional Hospital, CEO Scott Adams and Washington State University President Kirk Schulz, signed a document which defines the collaborative effort, known as "Partners in Excellence." Palouse Specialty Physicians: Our partnership with area hospitals Gritman Medical Center and Whitman Hospital & Medical Center is a joint effort to provide specialized health care services and clinicians to our region. Together we support ENT, Audiology, Urology, Neurology and Oncology.

Whitman County Health Network: Created as part of a HRSA Network Development grant, the Whitman County Health Network (WCHN) represents the united voice of Whitman County constituencies in the development, coordination and delivery of health and human services.

Life in Pullman

Welcome to the heart of the Palouse, one of the most beautiful places in the Pacific Northwest. Home to 34,000 people, Pullman is known for low crime rates, the place to raise a family, and a continual source of innovation influenced by WSU's flagship campus. Hiking, fishing, biking, snowshoeing, golfing and fostering a love for the outdoors is a natural draw for many tourists and enjoyed all year long by locals.

Spokane, WA (population 447,00) is 75 miles North and Seattle, WA (population 724,000) is 280 miles West. A regional airport right here in Pullman makes distanced travel easy and efficient.

K-12 Education

School aged children in our community have two public school options: Pullman School District and Pullman Community Montessori, a public charter school which provides K-9th grade education. The Pullman School District averages 2,819 students and are served by 160 teachers with an average of over 12-years of experience with 70% of the teachers holding Master's degrees. The Pullman Community Montessori is a 'choice' public charter school that will serve 94 K-5th grade students in the 2021-2022 school year and grow each year by one class level until it reaches 300 students in K-9th grades.



Higher Education

Washington State University (WSU) is a land-grant university that was founded in 1890 in Pullman, WA. Since that time, WSU has reached across the State of WA and established campuses in Spokane, Tri-Cities, Vancouver, Everett, and a Global Campus (online). WSU provides students with 101 majors, 79 master's degree programs, 65 doctoral degree programs and 3 professional degree programs in medicine, pharmacy, and veterinary medicine. WSU is a member of the Pac-12 Conference and provides the opportunity for fans to enjoy their favorite sports from swimming, football, basketball, volleyball, baseball, track and field, soccer, golf, rowing, and tennis.
